P 18-4 Footnote 1: The definition of solid waste facility given in this footnote is different than the regulatory definition in CCR Title 14. The regulatory term for "container site" is "Limited Volume Transfer Operation" and, as an operation (not a facility) is **not required** to be identified in a jurisdiction's NDFE. Compost **operations** are not required to be identified in the NDFE, but compost **facilities** are. The difference between operation and facility (municipal solid waste, compost or construction/demolition waste is generally based on tonnage received per day)
