We were unable to speak at the April 19 meeting regarding the Health and Safety aspects of the General Plan. We are addressing the Energy Element component of the plan and support Alternative A.

My husband and I moved here 7 years ago to escape the pollution, traffic and overcrowded Sacramento Valley. Here in Humboldt we have found a safe haven, but see that every community has it's own set of challenges.
