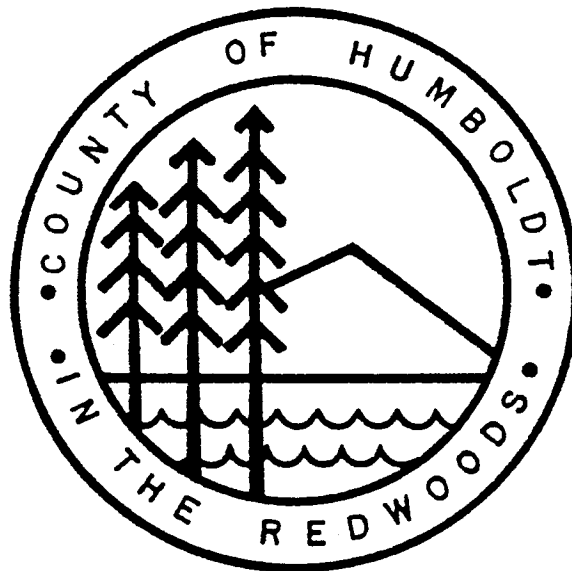

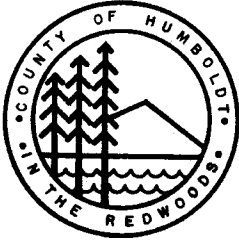

To The Citizens of Humboldt County:


